So we are looking at a lot of expense! We are investigating funding via grants and we would be grateful for any offers of expertise in this area. Shannon Brooks kindly donated a projector to the hall which is available for bookings. Beckington Players once again put on a memorable Panto, with proceeds from this completing our funding for the playground replacement. This was completed earlier this year and looks very smart. Plans are underway for equipment to extend the age range of the park and make it more inclusive.

The Safari Supper was another fantastic evening, organised by Jemma Hillman, thank you Jemma and hosts for such a successful evening raising a huge amount for the hall. Pantaloons gave an hilarious evening of entertainment and the weather
